Consideration is always given to finding the best light sources for accurate colour rendering, for angle of delivery, for long term maintenance and running costs and for environmental and ecological considerations.












Heritage Lighting

Internal Lighting





Internal building lighting encompasses the calculation and provision of the correct levels of ambient light as set within the CIBSE Code as well as using light to enhance the particular features of the property.
